Mission of the month Tearfund

At this year's Tearfund lunch we will be focusing on the Ivory Coast. Tearfund's work in Ivory Coast dates back to the 1980s and expanded in response to a series of conflicts following a military coup in 1999 and a disputed election in 2010. Their work in the country is mainly through local churches, supporting them to bring transformation to their whole communities.

Through local churches they are:

- Helping communities affected by extreme poverty.
- Supporting women and children who have experienced sexual and gender-based violence.
- Equipping farmers affected by deforestation and climate change.
- Providing access to clean water and adequate sanitation, particularly for people living in rural areas.

Thanks to Tearfund's training and support, local churches are enabling transformation, releasing people from poverty for good.

Vicar's Comment

As we approach Easter, we are once again running a St Christopher's small group - as we normally do at this time of year. In these small groups we will be doing a course called 'Fruitfulness on the Frontline' - which is all about understanding how God can use us in our various contexts, in the whole of life. When we become Christians, we are safe in God's care for all eternity, but the Lord also becomes our King and Master - and so life becomes about loving and serving Him; and loving and serving those around us.
