

Curate's comment

God seeks to make us His children by adoption. In a normal process of adoption as we know it, children brought into a family by adoption usually have little or nothing to say about the process. But this happens when parents who are seeking a child start this process alongside social workers who are helping to make that a reality. I recently spoke to someone who is going through this process. This person was sharing with me how hard this process can be. How many meetings and training him and his wife have attended and how costly it can be financially. However, he concluded that, even though they are finding the process to be difficult and complicated, they can't wait to complete the process and have these children home with them.

In a sense our God has done the same, He has invested and done so much in order to bring us into relationship with Him. The death of Jesus on the cross is the perfect example of how much it cost God to bring us into that relationship with Him. It cost Him everything yet He is still working so hard every day to make sure this process of adoption that He completed, should continue to be a reality for all of us. And we have been given this gift, by the Holy Spirit of becoming His sons and daughters. We can be safe and secure in this relationship as His children and need have no fear that this relationship will ever change or end because of the great price God has paid to make this special relationship possible.
