Mission for the month - Tearfund

Tearfund tries to speak out where they see injustice affecting people's lives.

In theory, the laws and constitution of a country are meant to provide the basis of a just society. However, in practice, good laws on paper are not always implemented or enforced. In the book of Amos we read about the injustice being experienced by many people at that time. The rights of people living in poverty were not respected, bribery was common and those who stood up for justice and truth were despised.

The Bible makes it clear that Christians should share God's passion for justice. This does not simply mean trying to live good lives. We should also seek to change what is wrong in our society. This may be through prayer, practical caring or speaking out against injustice. Often it will be a combination of all of these.

God wants righteousness and justice to flow like the water in a fast-flowing river, and He wants to use His church to bring this about (Amos 5: 24).

Vicar's Comment

In my old church on the Wirral, I was once really struck by the testimony of one lady, who was describing her own faith. She shared this from the front at a church service. She said something along the lines of 'I realised I was very small, but that I was in God's hands, and His hands are very big'. These words really stuck with me, and I've recalled them at various times whilst I've been signed off work.

It's been a really difficult time for me, but it's reinforced for me just how utterly dependent on the Living God we are. Left to ourselves we are powerless - powerless against sin, powerless against death, powerless against Satan and his forces of darkness. But if we are in Christ, we are safe. In fact, in Christ we are victorious. As the Bible says 'But thanks be to God! He gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ' (1 Corinthians 15: 57, NIV). In this life we will always be vulnerable and small (I know I am!) but we are in God's hands and His hands are very big.
