### Mission for the Month Crosslinks

When did you last hear Moldova mentioned in the news? Could you even locate it on a map of Europe? It is sandwiched between Ukraine and Romania and was part of Russia until the 1990s. It is currently the second poorest county in Western Europe, after Ukraine.

So when **Crosslinks** workers, Sarah and Matt Gurtler, moved there in January 2024, they felt more than a little daunted by the fact that they needed to learn both Russian and Romanian languages.

They are serving at Logos Church, situated in the capital city Chişinău, where they even find that the hymns are sung in both languages and that the sermon is preached in Russian and then translated live into Romanian. Vocabulary from one language is mixed in with the other.

The Russian war in Ukraine has only made things even more complicated. The government is pro-European and wants to step closer to the Romanian side of things, but there's been an influx of Ukrainian refugees who can't speak Romanian, but can speak Russian. English is of very limited usefulness, but it does provides a great outreach opportunity as young people will often jump at the chance to come to an English-speaking club, especially if it's run by native speakers.

And as their Moldovan pastor said to them 'It's possible for people not to understand each other well when they speak the same language. And it's possible for people speaking different languages to understand each other perfectly!'

# Vicar's thought

I've been thinking recently about what it means to be 'in Christ'. We pray in the name of Jesus Christ, we see many references in the Bible to the blessings of being 'in Christ'...but what does it mean? Well, first off - I feel a bit like I'm only scratching the surface of understanding this myself! But to give a few thoughts.....yes we are saved through Jesus and his work, but living in the state of salvation involves a continuing dynamic connection to the risen Jesus through the Holy Spirit. It is not just that we were saved in the past, but when we first believed we entered a continuing state of salvation. And it's not just that in the past we believed, but that when we first believed we entered a continuing state of believing. Being 'in Christ' involves living in a dynamic reality in which we are connected to the risen Jesus. Perhaps in English saying 'I believe' doesn't quite capture this, perhaps saying 'I am believing' would be better. And finally, if we believe, we are now living in a state of being a new creation.

As 2 Corinthians 5:17 says, 'Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come: The old has gone, the new is here!' (NIV). We were not just a new creation when we first believed, in Christ we are a new creation - so let's live like it to his glory!
